

TO THE GREENLAND SCHOOL DISTRICT  
GREENLAND, NH

The Greenland School Board met in special session on March 6, 2008 at 6:30 p.m. at the Greenland Central School.

CALL TO ORDER School Board Chairperson Ann Mayer called the meeting to order at 6:35 p.m.

ROLL CALL Present: Rich Carlin, Jim Haslam, Ann Mayer, Tina Rockefeller, Martha Stone, School Board Members; Dr. George Cushing, Superintendent of Schools, Jim Katkin, SAU 50 Business Administrator, Mary Lyons, SAU 50 Director of Pupil Services and Peter Smith, Principal.

VISITORS Mrs. Mayer acknowledged and welcomed visitor and School District Moderator Dean Bouffard.

PREPARATION FOR ANNUAL SCHOOL DISTRICT MEETING Mrs. Mayer suggested that the Board review the school district warrant and the articles therein to further anticipate any questions and to review who would speak to which issues. She noted that both the School Board and Budget Committee recommended figures appear in article 1 and it was suggested that the difference between the two be reviewed should it be raised at the meeting. Mr. Katkin reviewed with the Board the line items and amounts that had been reduced by the Budget Committee reflecting the difference between the two figures. Mrs. Mayer then distributed a sheet denoting who would make motions and seconds and speak to which articles as they were addressed during the meeting. A question was raised regarding the difference between articles 4 and 5 and Mr. Carlin reviewed the intent of each as he would be the one to speak to these articles at the meeting.

OLD CAFETERIA RENOVATIONS Mrs. Mayer asked Mr. Katkin to update the board with regard to the status of renovations to the old cafeteria. Mr. Katkin explained that the start of those renovations had been further delayed due to requests for more extensive documentation by the State Fire Marshall's office. He went on to explain that since the local Building Inspector had involved the state in the permitting process we were now being held to a higher level of scrutiny than might otherwise have been the case. He felt confident that we could produce the documentation necessary but was concerned about delays due to a back log in review at the state level.

ADJOURNMENT On a motion by Mrs. Stone, seconded by Mr. Carlin the Greenland School Board adjourned from their meeting at 6:55 p.m.
